+ Extra activity

Write My granny is an arsonist! on the board. Quickly tell students the story of your 'granny': that she lived near you in a quiet little village and that two years ago the police arrested her, charged her with arson and sent her to prison. She burned seven buildings before they caught her! Ask students: How do you think Granny (your surname here)'s life has changed? And elicit a sentence with used to and another with didn't use to, e.g. She used to have barbecues in the summer – she can't have them in prison of course! She didn't use to do exercise but now she does 30 minutes every day. Put students into pairs to invent more sentences with used to about how they think life is different for your granny. Then ask students to share some of their ideas with the class.

MATURITNÍ TÉMATA

The pride of Czech cuisine is **Beef Sirloin in Cream Sauce** (Svíčková na smetaně), a common Sunday family dish. The sirloin is marinated and then roasted with root vegetables, mainly carrots, celeriac, parsley root and onions. The vegetables and the meat juice are then blended and made into a sauce by adding cream and flour. The sliced meat is served with this sauce, bread dumplings, whipped cream, a slice of lemon and cranberry sauce.

Another typical, easy-to-find Czech dish is **Goulash**. Large pieces of beef are slowly cooked with onion, garlic, tomato puree and spiced with paprika to make a thick meaty sauce. This Goulash stew is served with bread dumplings or sourdough bread. Sometimes game is used instead of beef.



A perfect example of traditional Czech food is **Schnitzel**. A piece of tenderised meat, which is usually pork or chicken, more rarely veal, is coated with flour, beaten eggs and breadcrumbs, and fried. Schnitzel is usually served with boiled potatoes or **potato salad**. The traditional Czech version of the latter is a mixture of potatoes, carrots, onions, hard-boiled eggs and pickled gherkins, flavoured with mayonnaise and mustard. **Fried cheese**, referred to locally as "smažák", is a classic Czech vegetarian dish. A slice of breaded Eidam or other hard cheese is deep-fried and served with French fries and tartar sauce.

Desserts and Sweet Dishes

Czechs enjoy their **desserts** and a number of desserts that originated in the Czech Republic are popular in Central Europe. Traditional Czech cuisine also incorporates sweets as a main dish. The most popular **sweet dishes** are **pancakes**, which are usually served with jam, **buns** filled with curd-cheese, poppy seed or plum, cheese pasta with sugar and poppy seeds, **fruit dumplings** or small **sweet buns** served with hot custard.

"Žemlovka" is a traditional **sweet bread pudding** made with slices of buttered white bread, which are dipped in a mixture of sweetened milk and eggs and layered with grated apple, cinnamon and dried fruit.

Snacks

Potato pancakes are often seen at Czech fairs, markets, and festivals. They are made by simply blending grated potatoes, crushed garlic, onion, milk, caraway seeds, marjoram, flour, and eggs, and pouring rounds of this mixture into a pan using a ladle. They are then fried until golden brown and crispy on both sides. Other typical snacks are **hot dogs** or **smoked sausages** with bread, mustard and horseradish.

You will find Czech **open sandwiches** called "chlebíčky" everywhere. It is a tasty snack where the main ingredient is a slice of French bread with a wide variety of toppings: ham, salami, cheese or pickled herring, garnished with a little potato salad and pickled gherkins.




